There are also many volunteer opportunities in this sector, so you can try out a position before you decide that this is the sector for you.


Food & Beverage



Tourism: A world of opportunity

The sectors of tourism

The tourism industry has been divided into eight different sectors or areas. The following sector descriptions are brief overviews.

As with other industries, there is overlap in the tourism sectors. For example, the position of Small Business Owner/Operator will occur in every sector, for every sector has entrepreneurs who started up their own businesses. Similarly, although retail services is listed as part of the tourism sector, smaller retail outlets exists in almost every other sector as well.

Accommodation

The work site choices available to those interested in the accommodation sector are enormously varied and diverse.

They range from large, deluxe hotels in major urban centres, to small quaint, out-of-the-way motels; from small fishing camps and guest houses to huge world -class resorts.

Facilities may include meeting rooms, restaurants and bars, entertainment outlets and fitness facilities, or may be as simple as a bed and breakfast operation that offers all the comforts of home.

This sector is broken into the following facilities:

- All inclusive properties: the room, food and beverages, all services, taxes and gratuities are included in one price which is usually paid for prior to departure for the destination.
- Bed & Breakfast: closely related to guest houses, they are traditionally private homes which take in guests with breakfast included in the price of lodging.
- 3. Hotels: which may be classified as:
- Resort Hotels
- Commercial Hotels
- Luxury Hotels
- Deluxe Hotels
- Budget Hotels
- Airport Hotels

- Condominium Hotels
- 4. *Guest Houses:* designed for overnight or shortstay travelers desiring low cost accommodation.
- Villas: large fully furnished houses available for rent with the option of daily housekeeping service and the inclusion of a cook.
- Lodges/Bungalows/Cottages: located near the centre of some activity such as in Andros, the bone fishing flats.
- 7. *Yachts & Cruise Ships:* the facilities and services on these vessels compare in some instances to luxury resorts while others provided limited facilities.

The career opportunities are as diverse as the sector. For example, you may find positions as:

2. Adventure tourism & recreation



This is one of the fastest growing sectors in tourism. Careers in adventure tourism and recreation often centre

around sports such as tennis, golf, fishing, marine and park activities and sailing. Park services, wilderness education, environmental conservation and special interest (learning) adventures, such as bird watching or swimming with the dolphins, scuba diving and snorkeling, are included. Careers in this sector often require good physical fitness and specialized knowledge or skills. You can be a Fishing or Outdoor Guide, a Golf Pro or a Marina Attendant. This sector also attracts small busi-ness owner/operators that run their own adventure tourism/recreation businesses. Lots of entrepreneurial opportunities exists!

3. ATTRACTIONS



The atrraction sector focuses on tourism that entertains or educates. An example of a business in

this sector is the Pompey Museum. This sector includes casinos, museums, theme parks, zoos and aquariums. Many attractions are important sources of revenue to their communities. They often attract visitors from around the world, as well as people from the surrounding area.

There are many varied career opportunities in this sector, including Tour Guides, Interpreters, Ticket/Cash Attendants, Ride Operators, Retail Sales Clerks, Attraction Facility Guides, Museum Curators and Games Managers.

4. Evenus & conferences



This sector focuses on meetings, conventions, festivals, fairs, trade shows, cultural
